Official results take time. It is normal for unofficial results to evolve.

Security measures help ensure the integrity of results.

- ☐ Tabulation systems are separate from results reporting systems.
 - Many tabulation systems are protected by security measures such as encryption, multifactor authentication, physical access controls, and surveillance systems.
- In many counties, official election results are manually uploaded (rather than electronically transmitted) to reduce risk of hacking.
- Results reporting systems are safeguarded by cybersecurity protections and back-ups to ensure reporting data availability.

Election officials are the trusted source of info about elections.

Before sharing election information, consider verifying it with information shared by your state and local election officials.
