The National Protection and Programs Directorate's Federal Protective Service uses its security expertise and law enforcement authority to protect federal government facilities and safeguard the millions of employees and visitors who pass through them every day.



WHAT WE DO

- With a presence in every state and U.S. territory, the Federal Protective Service (FPS) uses its security expertise and law enforcement authority to protect more than 9,000 Federal Government facilities and safeguard millions of employees and visitors daily.
- FPS' mission is to provide integrated security, law enforcement and protective intelligence capabilities to ensure the continuity of federal business and the safety of the employees and visitors who rely on those services.



- Threats facing federal facilities include: theft, active shooters, vandalism, cyberattacks, workplace violence, assault, improvised explosive devices, unauthorized entry, disruption of access control systems and hostile surveillance.
- In service of its mission, NPPD provides the following:
 - » Leadership for the Interagency Security Committee which safeguards U.S. nonmilitary facilities from all hazards by developing state-of-the-art security standards in collaboration with public and private homeland security partners;
 - » Security assessments of federal facilities to identify risks;
 - » Security countermeasures to help federal agencies mitigate risks;
 - » Visible law enforcement presence;
 - » Oversight of contract security guards who conduct screenings and identity checks;
 - » Criminal investigations, including threats to federal employees;
 - » Monitor of and response to security alarms via centralized communication centers;
 - » Shared intelligence with federal, state and local law enforcement partners;
 - » Security during special events and critical incidents;
 - » Special operations, including K-9 explosive detection and HAZMAT response; and
 - » Training for federal tenants in active shooter response, crime prevention and emergency planning.
- NPPD's FPS is a fee-funded organization and its services are fully paid for by each federal agency it protects. FPS does not receive congressional appropriations.





To Serve and Protect

- » NPPD deployed law enforcement personnel to protect federal facilities and occupants during the 2017 hurricane season, and during several high profile events such as the "Bunkerville Standoff" – Bundy Trial at the U.S. Courthouse in Las Vegas, Nevada. In addition, immediately following the June 2017 Congressional baseball practice field shooting, FPS conducted site visits at 248 Congressional District offices which were located within FPS-protected facilities.
- » FPS provided law enforcement and security support to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) during Operation Unified Resolve, which involved the building and review of border wall prototypes.

Protects more than 9,000 federal facilities nationwide.

Serves 400 federal departments and agencies.



Employs approximately 1,500 FPS personnel, approximately **1,120** of which were law enforcement officers and special agents.



Employs approximately 13,500 contract Protective Security Officers.



Prevents 686,506 prohibited items from entering federal facilities each year.



Conducts 1,935 facility security assessments.



Dispatches employees to respond or investigate more than **2 million alarm notifications**, monitored 24/7 by FPS' four MegaCenters nationwide.



Performs more than **22,000 canine sweeps** using 83 explosive detection canine teams.



Made **1,317 arrests** and citations.
